### 25th Annual B.A.A.D. Tournament March 24-30, 2012

#### Team Rules and Responsibilities

##### Double elimination with one game championship

- 1) Mission Statement: The mission of the Basketball Against Alcohol and Drugs (B.A.A.D) Tournament is to provide a positive opportunity for youth to participate and showcase their skills in a tournament setting. The focus is on the appreciation and the development of athletic skills in a friendly atmosphere that is free of drugs and alcohol during the Spring Break. Our purpose is that each participant will make a long term commitment to a positive healthy lifestyle.
- 2) All teams will attend a mandatory 45 Minute Prevention class sponsored by Yellowhawk Prevention Services. Classes will be assigned to each team when you receive your team packets.
  - a. If all team members and coaches do not attend the mandatory Prevention activity, your team will forfeit the next game.
- 3) A quorum consisting of 5 Tournament Committee members shall have the authority to enforce all rules and conditions on teams, coaches, participants and spectators. Failure to comply with the rules may result in expulsion, and if necessary law enforcement removal and/or referral for trespass prosecution.
- 4) Team Check In Packets:

All players need a copy of an official document to provide proof of age before they are allowed to play or participate in the B.A.A.D Tournament.

  - a. Proof of age verification accepted: Driver's license/permit, tribal enrollment card, birth certificate or state identification card with photo. **A current photo ID must accompany age verification for the 12 – 14 and 15 – 18 brackets.**
  - b. All copies or proof of age should accompany the team roster to avoid a protest and will be checked at the team check in before the team's first game.
  - c. All team members will stay within their age brackets. There will be no age bracket jumping either down or up in any bracket. NO EXCEPTIONS with the following Birthday cutoffs:
    - Friday, March 23rd, must be between the ages 6-8
    - Saturday, March 24th, must be between the ages of 9-11
    - Monday, March 26th, must be between the ages of 12-14
    - Wednesday, March 28th, must be between the ages of 15-18

- d. Must arrive 1 hour before your first game to complete team check in and age verification.  
**GAMES WILL BEGIN ON TIME! However, a 5 minute grace period is allowed.**
- 5) Coaches and Players will be required to sign a Code of Ethics and Participation Release with the knowledge of team rules and responsibilities. If the code of ethics form is not signed by the coach and players, the team will not be eligible to play until signed by the second game.
  - 6) Coaches are responsible for starting line ups in the official book before each game. All players must be on the roster by the first game and no player can be added after the first game has been played.
  - 7) Any public ridicule by a player, coach, team or fan, **will not be tolerated** and will be handled through the Umatilla Tribal Police Department. Violations **may** result in Team Disqualification and barring from any other events by the 2012 B.A.A.D. Tournament. It is the Coach's responsibility to inform players and fans that there will be no ridicule of any player, coach, official, tournament staff or family while attending the 2012 B.A.A.D. Tournament at the tribal complex. Game Management Staff and the Tournament Committee can and will disqualify teams for physical violence, threat of harm to another, slanderous verbal assaults and instigation of bodily harm. Enforcement Decisions may be appealed to the Tournament Committee. The Tournament Director will enforce the decisions of the Tournament Committee.
  - 8) National Federation of High School Rules Apply with the following exceptions:
    - a. 6 – 8 year old Co-ed must have 2 boys and 2 girls on the court at all times. (3 girls and 2 boys or 2 girls and 3 boys). **16 minute running halves**, last two minutes clock stops. **If a team is up by 10 points then no press for the rest of half.**
    - b. 9 – 11 year olds, 20 minute running halves, last two minutes clock stops.
    - c. 12 – 14 year olds, 20 minute running halves, last two minutes clock stops.
    - d. 15 – 18 year olds, 20 minute running halves, last two minutes clock stops.
  - 9) 30 point mercy rule after 10 minutes in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half. If any team is ahead by 20 or more points the clock will run without stopping and no press. If the leading team is ahead by 30 or more points the game will be stopped.
  - 10) Each team has 2 time outs per half. Time outs do not carry over into 2<sup>nd</sup> half or overtime. Overtime is 3 minutes. Each team has one time out for each overtime.
  - 11) One and one bonus on 7<sup>th</sup> team foul, double bonus 2 free throws on 10<sup>th</sup> team foul.
  - 12) Intentional fouls (flagrant) result in automatic 2 points and possession of the ball.
  - 13) 3 point line in effect. 3 point attempt is a 3 shot foul.
  - 14) Any technical foul on a player or a coach will sit out the rest of the game. Any second technical foul on a player or coach is an automatic disqualification from the tournament. A technical foul will result in the opposing team receiving an automatic 2 points and possession of the ball.

- 15) Any player, coach or fan will be held accountable for any damage sustained to the gym or facility and tribal complex and will be turned over for enforcement to the Umatilla Tribal Police Department for possible charges and damages.
- 16) Protests:
  - a. Protest form must be completed and submitted to the Tournament Committee prior to beginning of the game.
  - b. A \$50.00 cash non-refundable protest fee will be charged to the protester for each protest regardless of outcome.
  - c. It is the coaches, players and parents responsibility to see that a player in question has proper age verification with their roster and with the B.A.A.D. Tournament Committee before the first game is played. If an official protest is entered by another team before the game, the team in question must provide proof of age at that point. If the team is unable to provide proof of age player will sit out the game and all other games until proof of age is provided and verified. A full timeout (one minute) will be charged to team filing protest regardless of outcome of protest.
  - d. A team will be disqualified from the tournament if it has been found and proven that a player is falsely using another players name, number, or identification and is over/under the age limit of his or her bracket including gender.
- 17) The CTUIR, Education department staff, Yellowhawk Tribal Health Clinic staff, staff, and volunteers will not be responsible for any theft, injury or accidents during the 2012 B.A.A.D. Tournament.
- 18) No alcohol, drugs or tobacco are allowed on the premises of the CTUIR Tribal Complex. Any spectator found to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs will be asked to leave and not return. Any B.A.A.D. participant found to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs will be disqualified from the tournament. Further enforcement of this policy will be handled by the Umatilla Tribal Police.
- 19) All rulings per the B.A.A.D Tournament Committee are final.
- 20) All teams are required to clean up their respective areas and benches at the end of their game.
- 21) All Entry Fees, once received are non-refundable.
- 22) Award Selection Process:
  - a. Mr/Ms Hustle Award  
Purpose of award is to recognize one male and one female athlete in the 9-11, 12 – 14 and 15 – 18 age categories for their speed and agility through the tournament.  
This award will be determined by the coaches, all coaches will be given an opportunity to vote by ballot, picking a player from the opposite team after each game who demonstrated the above guidelines. Votes will be tallied by the Tournament Committee before the second to last game of the respective age bracket.
  - b. All Stars Award

Purpose of award is to recognize two athletes from each team in the 9-11, 12 – 14 and 15 – 18 age categories for positive attitude, sportsmanship, and playing ability.

This award will be determined by the coaches, all coaches will be given an opportunity to vote by ballot, picking a player from the opposite team after each game who demonstrated the above guidelines. Votes will be tallied by the Tournament Committee before the second to last game of the respective age bracket.

c. MVP Award

Purpose of award is to recognize one male and one female athlete in the 9-11, 12 – 14 and 15 – 18 age categories for who showed team play, positive attitude and high skill level throughout the tournament.

This award will be determined by the coaches, all coaches will be given an opportunity to vote by ballot, picking a player from the opposite team after each game who demonstrated the above guidelines. Votes will be tallied by the Tournament Committee before the second to last game of the respective age bracket.

d. Team Sportsmanship

Purpose of award is to recognize one team in the 6-8 co-eds, 9-11, 12 – 14 and 15 – 18 age categories for playing overall a positive game, showing respect to the referees, tournament staff and other teams. This is recognized on the actions of the team and the coach.

This award will be determined by the officials of the tournament, at the end of each game the officials will be given a ballot to name the team they felt had the best sportsmanship of that game. Votes will be tallied by the Tournament Committee before the second to last game of the respective age bracket.

e. Ballots - will be issued at the completion of each game to the coaches and referees. They must be completed immediately after the game and turned in to the Registration table.

23) Absolutely no dunking or hanging on the rim, the player caught doing so will receive a technical foul and pay any damages.

24) **Sportsmanship is an absolute must and required by all in attendance.**
